

# **READ AND FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS**

# WARNING

- Before you assemble this product, find a level ground site with at least 2m (6ft) of clearance from any structure or obstruction. This product must have 2m (6ft) clearance on all sides.
- This product is for family domestic outdoor use only. Not designed for use in day care, nurseries, commercial or other public places.
- Continuous and competent adult supervision of children is required at all times when on or around this product. Never leave children unattended.
- Locate the product on a level, solid base. Do not install the product on mud, sand, soft or loose soil condition, as the product may sink, lean to one side and become unstable.
- Never jump from this product.
- This product is designed for use by children from ages 3 to 10 years under adult supervision.
- Only one child on this product at a time with a maximum weight of 50 kg (110 lbs). Do not exceed the intended weight limit or the maximum number of users for this product.
- Only for domestic use. This product is to be assembled and disassembled by adults only.
- Check all nuts and bolts regularly to ensure product stays sturdy.
- To prevent serious injury, do not allow children to use this product until it is completely assembled.

#### X2. SECTION 4 OF THE CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION'S OUTDOOR HOME PLAYGROUND SAFETY HANDBOOK<sup>7</sup>

X2.1 Select Protective Surfacing—One of the most important things you can do to reduce the likelihood of serious head injuries is to install shock-absorbing protective surfacing under and around your play equipment. The protective surfacing should be applied to a depth that is suitable for the equipment height in accordance with ASTM Specification F1292. There are different types of surfacing to choose from; whichever product you select, follow these guidelines:

X2.1.1 Loose-Fill Materials:

X2.1.1.1 Maintain a minimum depth of 9 in. (229 mm) of loose-fill materials such as wood mulch/ chips, engineered wood fiber (EWF), or shredded/recycled rubber mulch for equipment up to 96 in. (2438 mm) high; and 9 in. (229 mm) of sand or pea gravel for equipment up to 60 in. (1524 mm) high.

**NOTE:** An initial fill level of 12 in. (305 mm) will compress to about a 9 in. (229 mm) depth of surfacing over time. The surfacing will also compact, displace, and settle, and should be periodically refilled to maintain at least a 9 in. (229 mm) depth.

X2.1.2 Use a minimum of 6 in. (152 mm) of protective surfacing for play equipment less than 48 in. (1219 mm) in height. If maintained properly, this should be adequate. (At depths less than 6 in. (152 mm), the protective material is too easily displaced or compacted.)

**NOTE:** Do not install home playground equipment over concrete, asphalt, or any other hard surface. A fall onto a hard surface can result in serious injury to the equipment user. Grass and dirt are not considered protective surfacing because wear and environmental factors can reduce their shock absorbing effectiveness. Carpeting and thin mats are generally not adequate protective surfacing. Ground level equipment – such as a sandbox, activity wall, playhouse or other equipment that has no elevated play surface – does not need any protective surfacing.

X2.1.3 Use containment, such as digging out around the perimeter and/or lining the perimeter with landscape edging. Don't forget to account for water drainage.

X2.1.3.1 Check and maintain the depth of the loose-fill surfacing material. To maintain the right amount of loose-fill materials, mark the correct level on play equipment support posts. That way you can easily see when to replenish and/or redistribute the surfacing.

X2.1.3.2 **Do not** install loose fill surfacing over hard surfaces such as concrete or asphalt.

X2.1.4 Poured-In-Place Surfaces or Pre-Manufactured Rubber Tiles—You may be interested in using surfacing other than loose-fill materials – like rubber tiles or poured-in-place surfaces.

X2.1.4.1 Installations of these surfaces generally require a professional and are not "do-it-yourself" projects.

X2.1.4.2 Review surface specifications before purchasing this type of surfacing. Ask the installer/ manufacturer for a report showing that the product has been tested to the following safety standard: ASTM F1292 Standard Specification for Impact Attenuation of Surfacing Materials within the Use Zone of Playground Equipment. This report should show the specific height for which the surface is intended to protect against serious head injury. This height should be equal to or greater than the fall height – vertical distance between a designated play surface (elevated surface for standing, sitting, or climbing) and the protective surfacing below – of your play equipment.

X2.1.4.3 Check the protective surfacing frequently for wear.

X2.1.5 Placement—Proper placement and maintenance of protective surfacing is essential. Be sure to:

X2.1.5.1 Extend surfacing at least 72 in. (1829 mm) from the equipment in all directions.



SET UP

#### Site preparation and requirements

- Place the product on level ground, with at least a 2m (6ft) space from any structure or obstruction such as a fence, garage, house, overhanging branches, laundry lines, lamp post, or electrical wires.
- Create a site free of obstacle that could cause injuries such as tree stumps and/or roots, bricks, rocks, sprinkler heads and concrete.


### **ASSEMBLY PREPARATION**

#### Selecting the final location

 The area where the Slide is to be set up must be absolutely flat and level. Do not set up the product on a slope or inclined surface.


#### Preparing the Slide for assembly







**ASSEMBLY OF SLIDES - K1**

ASSEMBLY OF SLIDES - K2 & K3








#### ASSEMBLY OF SLIDES AND LOWER LEG





ASSEMBLY OF SUPPORT LEGS AND LOWER LEG







ASSEMBLY OF UPPER LEGS - Step anchor sleeve (C1)




ASSEMBLY OF UPPER LEGS - Step (C)






#### ASSEMBLY OF UPPER LEGS AND LOWER LEG

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### MAINTENANCE

# IT IS IMPORTANT TO CHECK AND TIGHTEN ALL HARDWARE AT THE BEGINNING AND DURING THE SEASON.

#### At the beginning of each play season:

- Tighten all hardware.
- Check all protective coverings on bolts, pipes, edges, and corners. Replace if they are loose, cracked, or missing.
- Check metal parts for rust. If found, sand and repaint using a nonlead-based paint meeting the requirements of 16 CFR 1303.

#### Twice a month during play season:

- Tighten all hardware.
- Check all protective coverings on bolts, pipes, edges, and corners. Replace if they are loose, cracked, or missing.

#### Owners shall be responsible for maintaining the legibility of the warning labels.

#### **Disposal instructions:**

- Disassemble and dispose of the playground equipment in such a way that no unreasonable hazards will exist at the time the equipment is discarded. Follow all local disposal requirements.
- Fully disassemble the entire frame. Do not leave partially disassembled parts in areas accessible by children.
- Should you wish to recycle the steel tubing, take the frame to your local recycling center.
- All plastic parts can be recycled, take it to your local recycling center.
- Do not let children play with any disassembled parts meant for disposal, such as tubing, bolts, nuts, screws, etc.
- All rusted parts, bolts must be properly disposed of. Do not reuse them.
